



2. The believe and trust that people have on us. Financial, Emotional, Spiritual and Psychological support and contributions of well spirited individuals has been the life wire to the realization of our mandate.

CHALLENGES

- 1. Finance. Out of our proposed budget was 1.727.000.00 we were only able to realize the sum of N196.000.00 this affected us seriously as were unable to realize some of the target set.
- 3. Due to the fact that most of our members are students, this year's program witness a low turnout of our because the University of Jos was conduct its exams.
- 4. Warriors refusal to identify themselves with the relief materials we got i.e. the wheel chairs. That was a great challenge to us because we were able to get an organization that was willing to donate the required Wheel Chairs but since those identified Warriors rejected the wheelchairs so we were left stranded.
- 5. Publicity: this has been one of our major problems as a group since inception as most of our programs are poorly covered and in some case not covered at all. During this year's program we couldn't cover some programs because our phones were all down.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. We recommend that more sensitization should be given to Sickle cell warrior encouraging them to accept their condition and never see same as a limitation as letting them see them appreciate the fragility of their body.
- 2. More collaboration with Youth/faith base organization
- 3. Application for sponsorship and Grants to aid expand our area of coverage and impact.
- 4. Purchase of cameras for the group and public address systems to aid activities and visibility.
